



Biographic note: Dr. Agata Poniewierska-Baran is an academic teacher at the Institute of Biology, University of Szczecin, Poland, and a researcher at the Pomeranian Medical University in

Szczecin (PUM). In 2015, she obtained her Ph.D. degree in medical sciences (medical biology) at the Pomeranian Medical University in Szczecin, and her doctoral thesis concerned the metastatic potential of selected factors found in the serum of pancreatic cancer patients. In 2012, she participated in international research internships at the Stem Cell Institute, James Graham Brown Cancer Center, University of Louisville, KY, USA, and in 2013-2014 as a researcher employed at the Stem Cell Institute. She is a member of the Polish Society for Fundamental and Clinical Immunology, a young GI associate at the United European Gastroenterology, and a member of the team "IMMUNO - Experimental Immunology and Immunobiology of Infectious and Neoplastic Diseases" at the University of Szczecin. Her areas of interest include cancer cell biology, the process of cancer metastasis and progression, as well as stem cell biology and mobilization.
